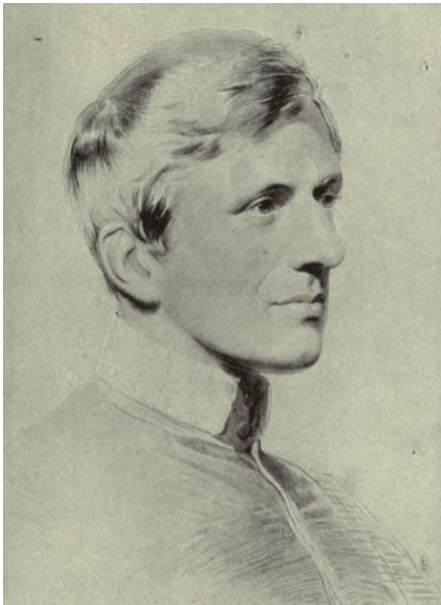


**'Cor ad cor loquitur'**
